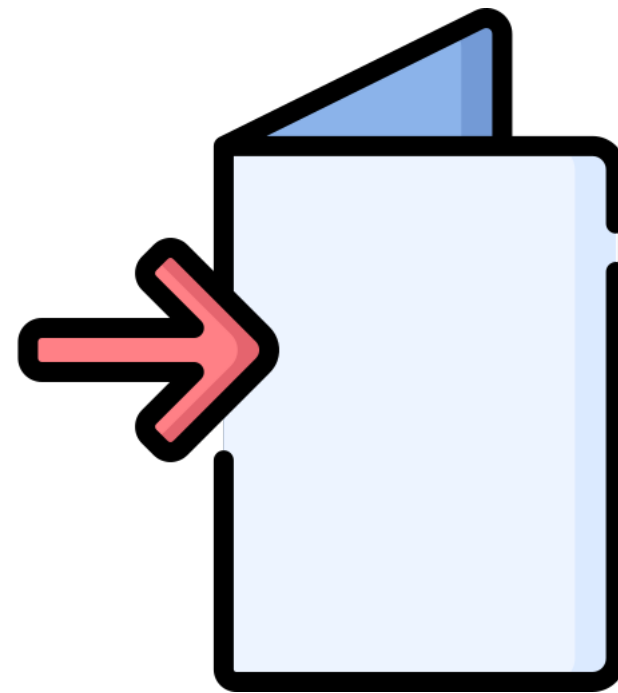
Display Slips

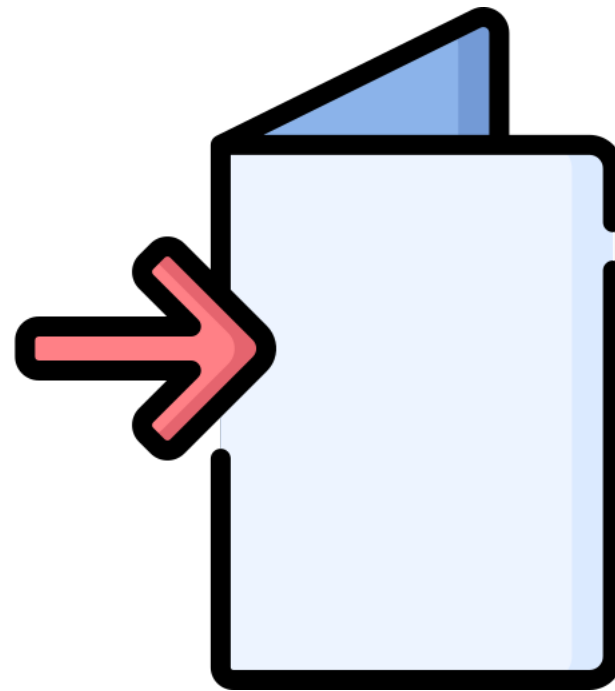
Font Variation

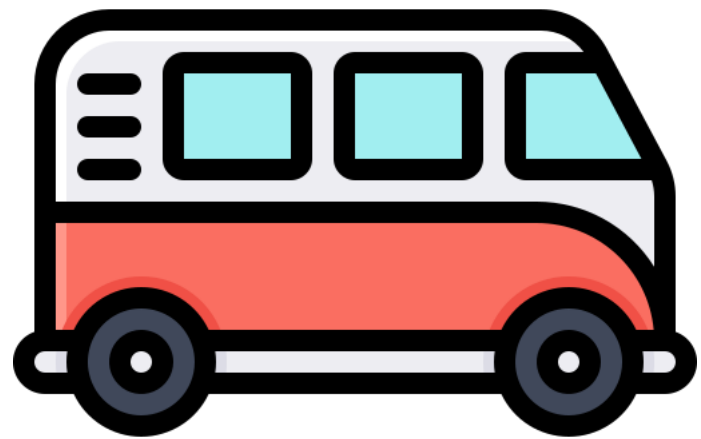

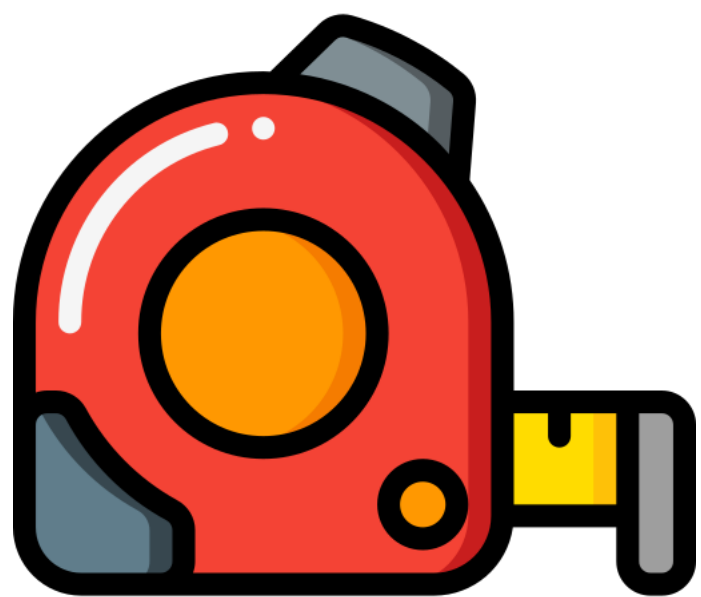

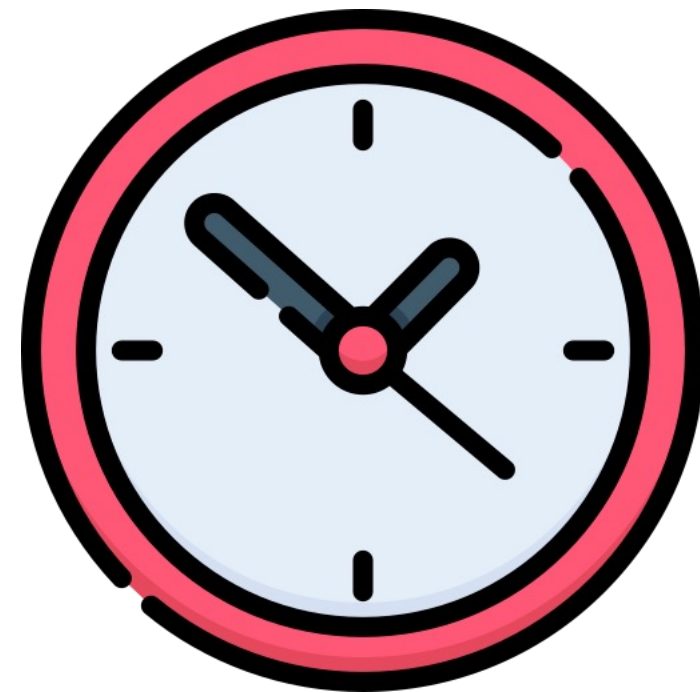
